### **Ron Dyvig**

Ron Dyvig is a native South Dakotan with an avid interest in astronomy and telescope making. This interest led him to his current work at the Badlands Observatory. He will be the speaker at Friday night's Banquet and again on Saturday at 1:30.

### **Marshalyn Baker**

Marshalyn Baker is a middle school mathematics teacher from Oakland Maine. This Presidential Awardee will present a 3-hour session on space and the solar system that aligns with the math standards and integrates well with other content areas.

### Janet Briggs

Janet Briggs is a veteran K-8 teacher who now is on staff at the Center for the Advancement of Mathematics and Science Education in Spearfish. She will do a presentation on science process skills and inquiry-based activities.

### **Betty Erickson**

Betty Erickson is the full time mathematics coordinator for Kearsarge Regional School District in New Hampshire. She is Presidential Awardee in Elementary Mathematics who has spoken at numerous regional and national conferences. Her topics are: Algebra Across the Primary Grades, Fractals at the Elementary Level; and Family Math Nights.

### **Andy Johnson**

Dr. Johnson is Associate Director for Science Education at the South Dakota Center for the Advancement of Mathematics and Science Education in Spearfish. With a background in physics, he is actively involved in reforming science education at all levels K-16. He will present two sessions: The Role of Misconceptions in Science Teaching and Inquiry in K-3 Math.
