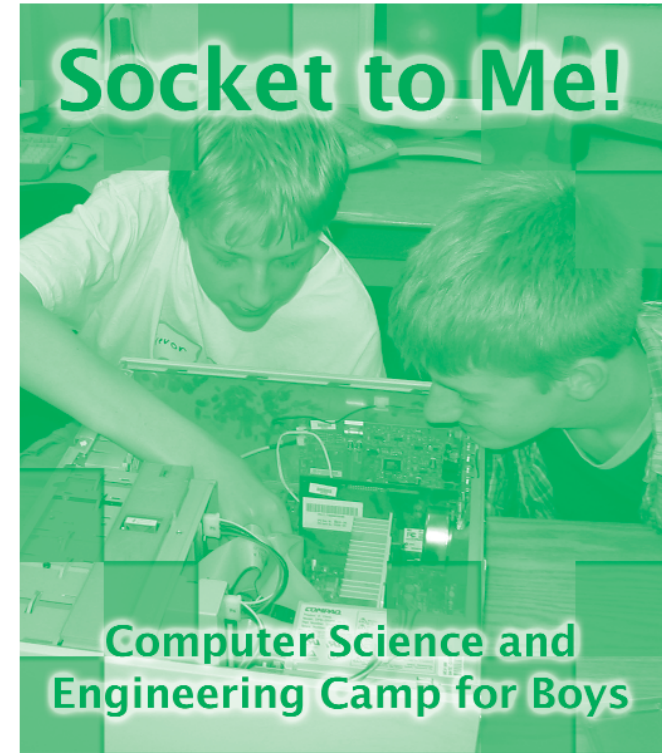

- Basic electronics

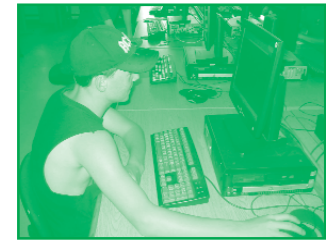
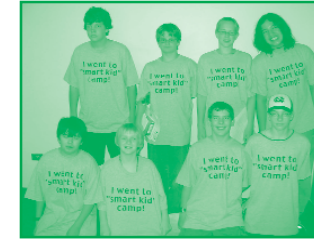
